Dead trees, branches, and ivy were cleared and removed from the historic **Old Fellowship Cemetery** in Tucker.

The Tucker Mission Gardening News

Tucker Mission Garden's hydroponic greenhouse was built in 2022 using mostly recycled materials thanks to a generous monetary donation from Tucker Missions and many enthusiastic gardeners in the congregation. There were six workdays during the year to prep, weed, plant, harvest, and then repeat. Dozens of folks of all ages joined to help when needed. The goal for 2023 is to increase that output and become financially self-sufficient. To kick things off, the Mission Garden team will have their first annual veggie plant sale on April 1, no fooling!
